# Communicative aspects of design

- Aim, structure and relevance of your Thesis

NORDCODE is organising a doctoral course consisting of three seminars. These are to be held in Skövde (April 2008), Lund (May 2008, in connection to the larger NORDCODE seminar), and Oslo (October 2008). The objective of the seminars is to support doctoral students within design research by providing them with an arena for discussing their ongoing research projects with peers and senior academics. In specific, focus is on developing the students' research design and methods, and enhancing their argumentation and reasoning skills. In addition, the seminars aim to encourage collaborative projects between participating universities. The theme of the doctoral course 2008 is 'Aim, structure and relevance of your thesis – methodological & argumentative skills'.

The course is free of charge and up to 12 PhD students will be accepted.

## **Application**

In the selection of participants emphasis will be placed on the quality of the applications, suitability of the topic to the Nordcode context, and even distribution of participants between participating universities.

To apply for the course, PhD-students should submit a 3-4 page application covering:

- A description of the student's doctoral project, including objectives, schedule, supervision etc.
- A brief description of the applicant's motivation for attending the seminars
- An abstract for a working paper (Note: This abstract is for the Lund seminar and there is no need to re-submit it later).

Deadline for applications is January 31<sup>st</sup> 2008. Notification of selections will be made by February 16<sup>th</sup> 2008.

# **Credits**

To qualify for credits on the course participants must attend all three seminars and complete the assignments. Upon doing so NORDCODE will issue a certificate of participation. The seminar series is typically accounted as a doctoral course of 7,5 ECTS. However, students are advised to check with their home university as to ensure that the seminars will count as formal credits towards completion of their PhD-studies.

#### **Seminars**

The series will consist of three seminars:

- 1<sup>st</sup> doctoral seminar: Skövde (Sweden), April 9<sup>th</sup>- 11<sup>th</sup>.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> doctoral seminar: Lund (Sweden), May 28<sup>th</sup>- 30<sup>th</sup> (in connection to the 7<sup>th</sup> NORDODE seminar & workshop).
- 3<sup>rd</sup> doctoral seminar: Oslo (Norway), preliminary dates: October 22<sup>nd</sup>-24<sup>th</sup>

#### **Structure & Reading assignments**

The seminars will consist of lectures and focused discussions on methods and theory in research on the communicative aspects of design. Focus will be on the Aim, Structure and Relevance of the participants Theses.

Participants are expected to prepare for each seminar through reading and writing assignments. Assignments and reading lists will be sent to participants in one month before each seminar.

# Writing assignments

Much time will be devoted to the participants own texts. The ambition is that these will progress through the following steps:

<u>For the Skövde seminar</u>: Draft version of work-in-progress paper. Please, pay special attention to the research background (theoretical foundations, relevance, research question, and proposed method). Due March 18<sup>th</sup>.

For the Lund seminar: Finalised work-in-progress paper. Due April 30<sup>th</sup>.

<u>For the Oslo seminar</u>: Thesis-level writing (chapter or article). (Deadline to be announced in connection to the seminar in Lund ).

In addition, participants are also expected to review and comment on texts written by peers. More detailed instructions will be given to participants.

#### **Costs and Scholarships**

Participation in the NORDCODE seminars is free of charge. Room and board in connection to the Skövde seminar will be covered by the University of Skövde and NORDCODE. However, participants are expected to cover their own room and board for the Lund and Oslo seminars.

If you for some reason cannot arrange the financing of your travel expenses through your home university, a limited number of NORDCODE Scholarships are available. To apply for a NORDCODE Scholarship, send a concise application (max 1 A4) to <a href="mailto:susann.vihma@taik.fi">susann.vihma@taik.fi</a> describing the situation and clearly motivating the relevance of your research to design research and the overall theme of the network. Applications for scholarships should be submitted together with the application to participate in the doctoral course, i.e. January 31<sup>st</sup> 2008.
